


Definition of Chinese Middle Class



- Annual income
 \$10,000 \$60,000
- College educated with stable jobs
- Mostly in large cities

China Presents Staggering Opportunities



Chinese consumption will increase from US\$1.7 trillion in 2009 to US\$16 trillion in 2020

Household Incomes Increased Dramatically

- Middle class income increased by almost 100%
- Rich people's income increased even more – by 250%
- Poor people are also better off – income increased 50%



Chinese Are Saving Less



- Saving rate dropped from 26% in 2004 to 12% in 2009
- Extra spending goes to big ticket items

Auto Industry



- World's largest market for automobiles
- Car ownership more than doubled, from 12% in 2004 to 28% in 2009
- Car ownership is predicted to surpass
 50% in urban areas by 2015

Luxury Goods

- World's 2nd largest market for luxury goods
- \$10 billion in 2009
- Predicted to reach
 \$27 billion in 2015



Healthcare Industry



- World's third largest pharmaceutical market
- Predicted to reach
 \$90 billion by 2014


E-Commerce
